DIOCESAN GUIDES AND HELPS

Pre-Initiation Inventory/Inventario de Pre-Iniciación

An excellent checklist for the interview to be conducted prior to acceptance into the Order of Catechumens. In particular, it helps to uncover marriage problems that must be settled. Available online, or in print from the Office of Worship in Spanish and in English.

Pre-Initiation Inventory for Children, with Worksheet/Inventario para la Pre-Iniciación de Niños, Junto con Hoja de Plano.

Like the one for adults, an excellent checklist for the interview to be conducted upon receiving a child seven years of age or older into the parish initiation process. Available online, or in print from the Office of Worship in Spanish and in English.

RCIA Handbook: A Guide to the Most Frequently Asked Questions.

Written and developed by the Diocesan Committee for the RCIA in collaboration with other interested groups, to answer your questions. In Spanish, *Manual de Rica: Guía par alas Preguntas más Frecuentemente Formuladas*. Both are available online, or in print from the Office of Worship.

Summit and Source. A Publication of the Office of Worship and the Liturgy Commission of the Diocese of Rockville Centre. Published quarterly, it has articles of interest to all who work for the implementation of the sacred liturgy in the diocese as well as registration materials for workshops given in the diocese. The Confirmation of Catholic Adults. Programs to Prepare Catholic Adults for the Celebration of Confirmation at Pentecost. Developed as an aid for parishes, these programs aim at assisting parishes in the preparation of already baptized Catholic adults for Confirmation at Pentecost. The booklet contains an extensive list of Catholic Updates arranged by topic.

NEW! *Sorting It All Out. Children and Adults in the Initiation Process.*

This leaflet presents 9 people who seek initiation into the church. These different scenarios are offered as helps to know what to do in each of these different situations. Available online, or in print from the Office of Worship.

Thomas H. Morris. (Paulist Press; \$14.95). Revised and updated, 1997. The most up-to-date resource available that offers general guidelines and practical directions on implementing all facets of the initiation process. Morris treat: sponsors, hospitality, time line, discernment, adaptations for children and candidates as well as all aspects of the periods of the RCIA.

The Catechumenate Answer Book. ML answers the 101 Most-Asked Questions.

Paul Turner. (Resource Publications; \$21.95) Offers to initiation ministers a unique blend of pastoral wisdom and solid academic understanding, packaged in concise question and answer format. Phone 1-408-286-8505.

The Hallelujah Highway

Paul Turner. (Liturgical Training Publications; \$19) A history of how the church has initiated adults and children over the centuries, related through the stories of people and documents that played significant roles in developing the rites and recording its development from the earliest days of the church to the present.

Saying Amen: A Mystagogy of the Sacraments.

Kathleen Hughes, RSCJ. (Liturgy Training Publications, \$17). The author teaches us how to reflect on the experience of sacramental celebrations (the mystagogical method of understanding sacraments). An excellent book for all catechumenate ministers.

NEW! Welcoming the New Catholic (3rd edition)

Ron Lewinski (Liturgy Training Publications \$10.00) A basic and thorough introduction to the Catholic church's way of inviting people into conversion and welcoming them into membership in the Catholic communion. A resource for new and experienced team members, pastors and parish staffs.

Celebrating the Rites of Adult Initiation. Pastoral Reflections.

ed. Victoria Tufano. (Liturgy Training Publications; \$7.95). These essays look at scrutinies, rite of acceptance, presentations and other rites during initiation.

NEW! Celebrating Initiation. A Guide for Priests

Paul Turner (World Library Publications; \$24.95) An excellent, concise review of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, commenting throughout with suggestions for priests.

Preparing the Rites of Initiation.

Bill Corcoran (Liturgical Press; \$3.95) This short book will help those who prepare parish liturgy to understand the vital relationship of the rites to the life of their communities, and how to help their communities celebrate them well.

THE PROCESS:

A Harvest for God. Christian Initiation in the Rural and Small-town Parish

Michael Clay (Liturgy Training Publications. \$18) Clay offers practical step-by-step insights into implementing the RCIA faithful to the rite and respectful of rural culture. Includes a reflection on small-town culture and society.

The Catechumenate and the Law. A Pastoral and Canonical Commentary for the Church in the US.

John M. Huels (Liturgy Training Publications, \$16.95). Drawing on the various sources of canon law related to Christian initiation, this book treats select canonical issues and pastoral questions that have canonical implications, such as: the rights and obligations of catechumens and candidates, doubts about the validity of baptism or confirmation, the initiation of younger children at celebrations of adult initiation, delay of confirmation; marriage cases, etc.

Come and See. A Lectionary-based Christian Initiation Resource Using Catholic Updates – 4th edition.

Compiled and Introduced by Karen Albertus. (St. Anthony Messenger Press, Leader edition, \$24.95, Participant edition, \$19.95) Outlines a comprehensive initiation process built on Scriptures, catechetical sessions, discipleship and seasonal celebrations.

Discerning Disciples. Listening for God's Voice in Christian Initiation (2nd edition)

Donna Stefan, S.C. (Liturgy Training Publications \$14.95) An excellent resource to help understand discernment during the whole process of initiation. It describes the decision-making process, and serves to improve listening skills and helps them ask the right questions at the right time.

Foundations in Faith. A Complete Resource Library for RCIA.

Maureen Kelly, managing editor (Resources for Christian Living, 1-800-822-6701; prices vary). This series provides catechist manuals and participant books for each of the various stages of the initiation process, with detailed sessions for dismissal and extended catechesis. Included with the series are handbooks for inquirers, sponsors, catechists, coordinators and priests.

One At The Table. The Reception of Baptized Christians.

Ron Oakham, with Kathy Browne, Rita Ferrone, Mark Searle and Joseph Favazza. (Liturgy Training Publications \$17) This book speaks to the expanding vision of initiation, offering historical, theological and pastoral reflections on this issue. Part II treats Pastoral Implementation, addressing formation of non-Catholics, both uncatechized and catechized Christians, as they prepare for Full Communion.

Real Stories of Christian Initiation

David Yamane and Sarah MacMillen with Kelly Culver (Liturgical Press. \$13.95) Based on data from participant observation and interviews, the authors tell "real stories" of the initiation process in five U.S. parishes. They offer a detailed analysis of the strengths and weaknesses of the RCIA process in each of the parishes. From these stories collectively they draw lessons *for* the RCIA as well as lessons *from* the RCIA for the church as a whole.

Readers Journal for the United States Catholic Catechism for Adults

USCCB Publication (\$9.95) The reflections in the journal support and further expand on the topics in each chapter of the USCCA, helping the reader deepen their encounter with the living Christ. Use the journal with catechumens as part of their preparation for the Easter sacraments.

United States Catholic Catechism for Adults

USCCB Publication (\$24.95) Each chapter in the United States Catholic Catechism for Adults includes stories, doctrine, reflections, quotations, discussion questions, and prayers to lead the reader to a deepening faith

NEW! When Other Christians Become Catholic

Paul Turner (Liturgical Press, \$23.95) Turner seeks to clarify and confirm the status of baptized persons who enter into full communion of the Catholic Church. In addition, he discusses discerning readiness, ritual issues and the situation in the United States. Available from Amazon.com

Year-round Catechumenate.

Mary Birmingham (Liturgy Training Publications; \$15.95)

A year-round Catechumenate may sound overwhelming and unimaginable, but the author shows that it is not only possible, but it is also the best stewardship of the gifts and talents of initiation ministers. This book will help you imagine, envision, understand and implement a year-round Catechumenate in your parish.

SCRIPTURE:

Breaking Open the Word of God. Resources for Using the Lectionary for Catechesis in the RCIA (Cycle A,B,C)

ed. Karen Hinman Powell and Joseph P. Sinwell (Paulist, \$14.95). This provides copious information for the catechist, and outlines for Sunday sessions of Breaking Open the Word. There are three volumes, one for each cycle.

Footprints on the Mountain. Preaching and Teaching the Sunday Readings.

Roland J. Faley (Paulist Press, paperback \$44.95; on CD-\$39.95) A thematic commentary on all 3 readings and the psalms for every Sunday in the Lectionary, with a brief spiritual reflection pointing out the implications for Christian life. The author provides a short list of topics related to each week's readings, which should be a great help to the catechumenal catechist.

Lights, Camera ... Faith! A Movie Lover's Guide to Scripture.

Malone and Pacatte. (Pauline Books and Media; \$29.95) This book provides a thought-provoking passage into the world of the Gospels through popular film. By exploring movies in the light of the Sunday Scriptures, the authors create a dialogue between Scripture and film. Available for all 3 Lectionary Cycles.

THE TEAM:

NEW! Guide for Sponsors. 4th edition.

Ron Lewinski (Liturgy Training Publications. \$6) A practical and spiritually enriching formational resource for sponsors. This revised 4th edition give particular emphasis to the differences that exist between sponsoring a candidate versus sponsoring a catechumen. Also available in Spanish: *Manual Para Padrinos y Madrinas de Catecúmenos*

When You Are an RCIA Sponsor.

Rita Burns Senseman (St. Anthony Messenger Press B4492; \$3.95 each; 50-99 copies: \$3.36 each; 100 or more: \$2..96). Explains the RCIA process, with suggestions for being a companion and witness on the RCIA journey.

Enter the Rose. Retreats for Unfolding the Mysteries of Faith with Catechumens, Candidates and All Believers.

Miriam Malone, SNJM (World Library Publications, revised edition, \$49.95) This resource provides all ministers of initiation with the tools needed to facilitate a variety of reflection and retreat experiences for RCIA. All are rooted in the gospel and the liturgical life of the Church. An audio CD that contains formational and inspirational support materials, and a CD-ROM containing reproducible journals for the retreats are included.

RCIA Spirituality. Formation for the Catechumenate Team

Barbara Hixon (Resource Publications. \$23.95) The catechumenal process is not something you do to someone else, it is something that happens to you, the team member, as much as to the catechumen. Hixon takes you deep into the spirituality of the Christian initiation process and shows you how each step can change your life. Gail Gensler's questions make this book a useful group formation tool for the catechumenate team.

A Child Shall Lead Them. A Guide to Celebrating the Word with Children.

Gerard Pottebaum, Sr. Paule Freeburg, D.C., Joyce Kelleher. (Treehaus Communications, Inc. \$14.95; 2 or more \$9.95 each) Describes the Celebration of the Word with Children, discussing ministers of the Word, how children relate to God and pray, nurturing responses, ways to evaluate and refine these celebrations.

Children's Catechumenate: Christian Initiation of Children

Long and Filippi (Houghton Mifflin Harcourt Religion Publishers) this series provides catechetical and scriptural formation for various levels for the initiation of children.

Children and Christian Initiation: A Practical Guide

Kathy Coffey (Living the Good News, Inc. Denver CO 1-800-824-1813; \$14.95; Handbooks, \$4.95; Journals \$5.95.) Full of useful ideas, and based on the RCIA, this book distills the best of age-appropriate ways to implement the process with children, including: ideas for preparation before the rites and reflection after the rites; activities that help children link scripture with their daily experience; suggestions for involving parents, sponsors and peer companions. It also explores the symbols and ritual gestures that help children become people of prayer.

Guided Meditations for Child Catechumens

Sydney Ann Merritt (Resource Publications. \$24.95) These guided meditations can help children make sense of the rites of Christian initiation — and connect their personal experiences to the Jesus story. There is a guided meditation script that you can use “as is” or adapt, discussion questions and suggestions for music that will enhance the children’s experience.

Christian Initiation of Older Children

Sandra Figgess, R.S.C.J. (Liturgical Press. \$7.95) Prepares non-baptized children of catechetical age, with the help of a parent, to become full members of the Church. It explores the meaning of baptism in the context of salvation history, explains the symbols and the ritual of baptism as described in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults and, finally, it looks at the Eucharist as the sacrament which nourishes the new life received in baptism.

Lectionary Based Catechesis for Children. A Catechist's Guide.

Sylvia DeVillers (Paulist Press, 1994, \$10.95) A explanation of lectionary-based catechesis, its development through the ages together with a methodology for today's catechists. Provides sample lesson-plans.

Readings in the Christian Initiation of Children

Victoria Tufano, ed. (Liturgy Training Publications; \$9.95) A compilation of many of the important articles on the initiation of children. It looks at the reform of children's initiation, working with the rite and pastoral issues.

To Walk With a Child. Homiletics for Children. A Guide.(with CD)

Gerard A. Pottebaum (Treehaus Publications, Inc., CD with book \$24.95) Explores how to engage children in homilies, whether in intergenerational assemblies, or liturgies expressly for children. Rooted in an understanding of the spiritual life of children, this presents principles and practices of homiletics for children

When Your Child Becomes A Catholic

Rita Burns Senseman (St. Anthony Messenger Press \$2.95) Explains Catholic teaching about Baptism and the other sacraments of initiation and the process of becoming Catholic. She describes the roles and responsibilities of parish sponsors and sponsoring families—the people who will be paired with your child and you on this faith journey. She also suggests activities for parent and child to get started on the road to Baptism.

FOR TEENS

SPIRIT, A Lectionary-Based Program for Teens.

Joan L. Mitchell, CSJ (Good Ground Press) A religion program suitable for use with the process of Christian Initiation adapted for teens. 28 four-page issues, one for each Sunday, October through April, bringing teens into dialog with Jesus in the Sunday gospel, and with people's needs in our world. Exploring the Sunday Readings.

A monthly four-page leaflet that provides a reflection on each of the Sunday readings, including questions for personal reflection and an "Action Response." This is also published in Spanish: *Parameditar las Lecturas Dominicales*.

NEW! How Do I Become Catholic? Also available in Spanish.

Ronald Lewinski (Liturgy Training Publications. \$9.95 for pack of 25, discounted for larger orders) Baptized Christians considering full reception into the Catholic Church have specific questions regarding full communion with the Church. Pastorally sensitive to the journey of faith already begun by the baptized, this leaflet directs inquirers to helpful sources for further information.
